
Enrollment History





SCHOOL ACCESSES "WAITING LIST"

Waiting list prioritized by:

- Attended EIA Preschool
- 2. Having a sibling/s currently enrolled in EIA
- 3. Supporter of EIA (Volunteer, Donor, etc)
- 4. Application Date

ENTRANCE EXAM/SCREENING

- Kindergarten: Interview Based Screening
- Elementary: Discretion of Committee (case by case)
- Secondary: 70% on each Assessment
- High School: 75% on each Assessment

Once successfully completing Steps 1-3, the Principal will review and provide approval to proceed to Step 4.



CAPITAL PROJECT FEE

Pay in Full

Once the non-refundable Capital Project Fee of \$3000 is paid, the Principal will provide final approval for Director of Student Services to accept the student.

Waiting List Challenges

- Many of the students are siblings of other EIA students
- Many of the students have been on the waiting list for several years
- We have reached our fire code limit
- We cannot overcrowd our class sizes any further without compromising the quality of education
- We do not have any additional classrooms or learning spaces to add more cohorts. We have exhausted our current facility to accommodate additional students.

Why is the Demand So High?

- Islamic education has become a necessary school choice
- Edmonton's Islamic community is growing
- EIA alumni are now enrolling their children into EIA
- EIA offers a high quality education
- * EIA offers an Islamic Environment
- EIA has a strong academic ranking within the province
- Parents feel threatened by secular education and other influences that contradict our Islamic values

- Kindergarten and Grade 1


Long Term Solutions

- Build a new Elementary School (capacity 1500-2000)


