Asalaam Alaikum Wa Rahmat Allah Sisters and Brothers.



CURRICULUM UPDATES

ISLAMIC STUDIES:

- The students will be learning Surat Almaoon and Surat Alomazah
- The students will memorize and recite the morning Duaa
- The students will learn the first 27 names of Allah SWT
- The students will continue to learn about our beloved Allah SWT (Guidance for Truth; Allah SWT is One; I love Allah SWT and Allah SWT loves me
- The students will learn about the hadith Afdel-u-Thikri La ilaha illa Allah

MATH:

- □ The students will continue to learn about numbers 1 20
- The students will demonstrating an understanding of repeating patterns (two or three elements) by:
 - identifying
 - reproducingextending
 - creating

LANGUAGE ARTS:

- → The students will be working on the short vowel sounds of a, e, i, o and u.
- → The students will segment and blend sounds in words spoken or heard
- → The students will use phonic knowledge and skills to read unfamiliar short vowel words in context
- → The students will associate consonants and short vowel sounds with letters and some letter clusters

ARABIC:

- The students will learn the following letters: (ل) (ل) (ل)
- The students will learn new vocabulary related to each letter.
- The students will read and write each letter with it's short and long vowels
- The students will form/write the letter with the different symbols at the beginning, medial and ending of words.

Arabic Alphabet






SOCIAL STUDIES:

- The students will continue to learn about roles in Home, School, and Community

- The students will value self and others as unique individuals in relation to their world.




SCIENCE:

- The students will learn all about colours; different colours including primary and secondary colours.
- □ We will learn how colours are created, what happens when they are mixed and how they can be transferred from one material to another.
- We will learn to distinguish and describe colours and work with a variety of materials.





Why Tardiness Matters!



- When our children arrive late to school they usually miss or arrive late to the most valuable time of their day (Morning Duaa).
- Children love to visit with their friends, if they are late they lose 5-15 minutes of socializing with their friends.
- They miss a constructive time of setting up their academic day.
- It can disrupt the flow of the already progressing lesson.
- It distracts the other students.

- Research shows that students who are late have a bigger chance in falling behind in their academics.
- Generally speaking it erodes class morale.
- Students who are late are less likely to feel less organized and prepared for the day.
- To speak quite frankly but with respect, you as parents are not getting the most of the tuition that you have worked hard for.
