• Qur'an:

- Revision of all memorized Surahs and verses covered throughout the year.
- Strengthening tajweed and proper pronunciation (makharij).
- Building confidence in recitation and fluency.

• Hadith & Du 'ā':

- Review of selected Hadiths learned, their meanings, and practical applications.
- Reinforcing memorized daily du'ā's with understanding of their context and benefits.

• Figh & Akhlaq (Manners) :

- Reflecting on Islamic behavior and manners practiced during the year (e.g., respect, honesty, cleanliness).
- Discussions on how to maintain Islamic character during the summer break.
